- (2) Please note if you list a Clinic as a 1st choice and have not satisfied the prerequisites or indicated above that you will take the course concurrently, you will automatically be put in the lottery for your 2nd choice (if you have satisfied that Clinic's co and/or pre-requisites).
- (3) It is a violation of the Honor Code to inaccurately indicate that you will have successfully taken a course by next semester or plan to take a course concurrently next semester.
- (4) **Students whose names were selected in the lottery to participate in Fall 2017 Clinics will be notified via email. Students will be contacted directly by law school staff to schedule a pre-registration meeting.**
- (4) A lottery is used for the selection of students in most clinics due to the limited class sizes and number of students who apply. Priority in enrollment is based on the following criteria:
1. Application submitted on time.
 2. Students who have not previously taken a clinic.
 3. Date of graduation. Students who are closest to graduation will be given priority.
