I. TIMELINE FOR APPEAL

A formal written challenge to a law school grade must be filed with the Associate Dean for Academic Affairs within thirty (30) calendar days after the later of the following: the final date on which grades are due to be posted or the date on which the grade is actually posted. All grade challenges must be on an official grade challenge form, available from the Office of Academic Affairs in the Dean's Suite or on the student portal.
